Based on Unit Std 19363	TASK 4: CARRY OUT SIMPLE PATIENT RECOVERY TECHNIQUES <i>(pick-off rescue)</i>	Competent or Not Yet Competent	
<p>NOTE Assessor is to brief candidate on the patient recovery scenario. Patient to be attached to 2x ropes (no knots) and positioned approx. 6m above the ground. Patient to be loaded on their ascending equipment and role play an “unconscious” patient. Candidate is to keep a safe position of back-up device(s) and ensure that they (and their patient) remain attached to a minimum of 2x ropes at all times.</p> <p>The rescue must be completed within 10 minutes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> time starts when the patient is in position and the candidate is on the ropes, in their descending equipment and 1m off the ground time ends when the patient is lowered to the ground <p>NOTE: Candidates may only use equipment that they “would normally carry on their harness”. Specialist rope rescue kits, such as haul-tracks, may <u>not be used</u> for this task.</p> <p>Candidate is to:</p>			
4.1	<p>Assess the situation involving recovery by rope:</p> <p>a) Identify all hazards associated with a rope rescue scenario</p> <p>b) Explain controls that could be used to manage the hazards</p>	C C	NYC NYC
4.2	<p>Prepare patient for descent:</p> <p>a) Demonstrate safe ascent / descent to reach the patient</p> <p>b) Position patient securely for descent (2x connections at all times)</p>	C C	NYC NYC
